

Preface.

The project to record recitations of all available Vedic recensions in India was conceived long ago in Pune, when I had several meetings with a number of priests and Vedic scholars. I realized then, that the tradition of Vedic recitation would soon disappear, as a result of India's changing social conditions.

Although there had been several attempts to record the Vedic recitation no complete recording of recensions of all four Vedas was available in the West. I therefore decided to establish a project to complete that task and applied to the Danish Research Council for Humanities for funding assistance. The Council provided full financial support for the project, in recognition of the importance and value of preserving the great Indian oral tradition.

I approached a number of scholars well versed in the recitation of their own Vedic recension and over a number of visits recorded as many as six separate recensions. Once completed Professor Shrikant Bahulkar prepared the catalogue of all the recordings from tape spools and cassettes.

For the sake of covenience all the recordings were transferred to 2 sets of audiocassettes with the original recordings now deposited in the Royal Library in Copenhagen.

The Danish ministry of Research has finansed the CD's, catalogue and last part of the project

The present catalogue contains all the recordings available on the audiocassettes and CD's.

The task of recording all the recensions and bringing the project to its conclusion proved daunting, and it would have been impossible to complete the work without the help of many individuals and organizations.

First, I must express my deep gratitude to the Danish Research Council for the Humanities and the Ministry of Research, who were generous in their financial and moral support for the project.

In this big collection of recitations there might be a few mistakes, especially in connection to Atharvaveda. But I have decided to include all the recordings, since late Pt. Vasudevshastri Pancholi was the last Pandit, who was able to recite Atharvaveda according to the tradition.
